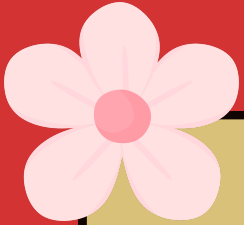
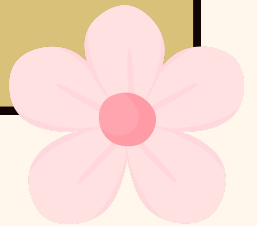

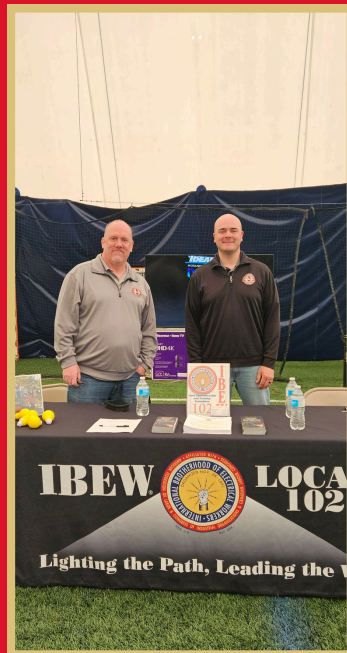

  - Write down what's on your mind

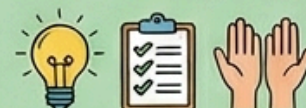
